This summer, we were blessed to have the most campers participate in our on-site programs since we have been tracking this number and probably the most in our 97-year history. While the power of camp is not in the numbers, we are grateful to have more opportunities to make a difference in the lives of those we serve, one camper at a time.

In order to keep up with our steady growth, we are pleased to announce a new shared Faith Formation Director position with St. John Lutheran Church in Dickinson. The director will spend one-third of her time with Badlands Ministries and two-thirds with the church. While the Faith Formation Director will work most of the school year for the church and dedicate summers to Badlands Ministries, she will also help Badlands Ministries with our adult trip, year-round retreats and events, and staff recruiting. We are thrilled to have long-time camper and former summer leadership staff Katrina Poss in this new role.

We have completed our What Now What Next sessions and have a detailed summary of the input we received on our website. We appreciated those who were able to participate as we reflected on our past, discussed big questions, and started planning for our next century of ministry. We are working with Fletemeyer & Lee (the same architecture and planning firm we used prior to move the camp in 2008), because they specialize in working with outdoor ministries. We hosted them for a site visit at the end of September and are working with them now to shape the input we received into our future plan. We are early in the process and look forward to having exciting news to share in the months ahead.

BADLANDS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND MINISTRY TEAMS



THREE MORE CAMPER CABINS GET A NEW INSULATED FOUNDATION AND NEW DECK

Before our camper cabins were cabins, they were canvas tents on a platform supported by posts. Over the years, the tent platforms were converted into cabins, but they kept their original base on posts. As camper cabin usage increases with a greater need to use these cabins in the winter, we are adding insulated foundations and new decks as funds allow. We were able to do one cabin before summer camp started and just finished three more at the end of summer. We have four more to complete.

CAMPERS ENJOY NEW SILENT DISCO EXPERIENCE

If you walked into our lodge or dining hall at times last summer, you would be shocked to see a silent dance party happening without hearing any music. Thanks to a grant from the City of Dickinson, we were able to purchase the equipment to host Silent Disco Dance Parties for up to 120 people. Music is streamed through three different channels at the same time and campers simply select which station they want to hear, and can change the channel any time. They can also

see what channel others are listening to by the color of light coming from the headphones. Everything is battery operated and Bluetooth connected. It has been more fun than we could have imagined, and our campers of all ages have loved it. Who knew a hundred teenagers could be so quiet!

SCORIA ADDED IN THREE LOCATIONS

We placed scoria on some roads at camp and created a new parking area. First, we added scoria on top of our dike on the road to our equestrian area to ensure vehicles and trailers could travel on that road in wet weather without damaging the dike. They we added a second entrance to our apartment located in our maintenance building and created a new separate parking area in front of the apartment as well. Finally, we placed some scoria on the loop in front of our staff/canteen building to use that road as part of our drive-in registration this summer.

This new machine will be in place prior to the start of camp next summer.


COMING SOON!

NEW SIREN EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

Badlands Ministries has been working with Cerberus Security of Dickinson ND to create a new emergency notification system to better serve our camp. Our old system consisted of manually ringing bells for alerting staff, campers, and guests of pending danger. While this tried-and-true method has worked since our nation was born, we can do better in 2025. Our new system will consist of five sirens strategically located through camp that can be remotely or manually activated and will be in place by next summer.


